# What's been happening this week?

## Nursery



This week in Nursery we have been reading the story of Jack and the Beanstalk. In Maths we have been learning about capacity, using the words full and empty. We also sowed are own cress seeds using cotton wool and are excited to see if they have grown next week.

## Reception



This week, in English we have continued to learn about Tiddler the story telling fish. We have been telling our own tales. One child said on the way to school it started to rain Doritos! In Maths we have been doubling using butterflies, ladybirds and dominoes. Also, we have used lots of different media when painting in the style of Vincent Van Gogh.

#### Year 1



This week, we have been comparing mass in Maths. In English, we replied back to Max's letter answering his questions in detail. In history we explored different theories as to how dinosaurs became extinct. One of the theories were 'Ice Age' and Sapphire Class tried to dig out our dinosaurs from ice!

#### Years 1 /2 & 2
